Tufts University Dr. Jean Mayer Global Citizenship Award and Christopher Award

Dr. Izzeldin Abuelaish (Dalla Lana School of Public Health) has been recognized with one of the Tufts University Dr. Jean Mayer Global Citizenship Awards for his "tireless work in spreading peace and hope throughout the world," and captured in his book, *I Shall Not Hate*. The award – offered by the Institute for Global Leadership - is given annually to individuals or organizations who are dedicated to solving the most pressing problems facing the world. The first recipient of the award in 1993 was Amartya Sen and other recipients have included Martti Ahtisaari, Romeo Dallaire, John Kenneth Galbraith, Mary Robinson, Wole Soyinka, Desmond Tutu, and Sir Brian Urquhart.

Dr. Abuelaish was also selected as a recipient of the prestigious *Christopher Award* in the "Books for Adults" category for *I Shall Not Hate*. First presented in 1949, the Christopher Awards were established to salute media (TV programming, feature films,

books for adults and children) that "affirm the highest values of the human spirit." Dr. Abuelaish will be presented with the award at a ceremony on May 24, 2012 in New York City.

2011 NSERC John C. Polanyi Award

Prof. Benjamin Blencowe (Donnelly Centre for Cellular and Biomolecular Research) and **Prof. Brendan Frey** (Donnelly Centre for Cellular and Biomolecular Research, Dept. of Electrical & Computer Engineering) have been recognized with the prestigious 2011 NSERC John C. Polanyi Award, which honours an individual or team whose Canadian-based research has led to a recent outstanding advance in the natural sciences or engineering. Professors Blencowe and Frey were honoured for their research that cracked the codes hidden in DNA that allows a relatively small number of genes to be transformed into hundreds of thousands of variations in a process called alternative splicing.

2012 CAME Ian Hart Award for Distinguished Contribution to Medical Education

Prof. Brian Hodges (Dept. of Psychiatry, Toronto General Hospital) has been recognized by the Canadian Association for Medical Education (CAME) with the 2012 Ian Hart Award for Distinguished Contribution to Medical Education for his "life-long contributions across the continuum of medical education to advancing medical education in Canada and internationally." Dr. Hodges, who holds the Richard and Elizabeth Currie Chair in Health Professions Education Research at UHN/U of T, was praised for his dedication to excellence in teaching, and the impact he has had on clinicians, educators and researchers involved in medical education and education research in Canada and beyond.

CHEC-CESC Virtual Patient Challenge

Dr. Adil Shamji (Family Medicine resident, Toronto East General Hospital) was the **1st place winner** in this year's CHEC-CESC Virtual Patient Challenge for his submission, *A Peripheral Predicament* virtual patient. Awarded by the Association of Faculties of Medicine of Canada (AFMC) and Canada Health Infoway, the 2011 Challenge recognizes important contributions to e-health and e-learning among Canadian medical students and highlights the utility of virtual patients for learning, teaching, and assessment.
