Last night, as many of you know, the [Faculty of Medicine](#) launched a [fundraising campaign](#) to help us deliver on our promise of improving health in Canada and around the world.

McLaughlin Centre's 2012 Accelerator Grants Program

Research grants focused on genomic medicine and totaling \$750,000 have been awarded to 16 Toronto-area teams and collaborators as part of the McLaughlin Centre's 2012 Accelerator Grants program.

Following last year's successful inaugural competition, grants were awarded during a research funding competition emphasizing work in three areas:

1. Generating genome-wide data to advance disease gene discovery or DNA-based diagnostics;
2. Development of tools (techniques/algorithms/databases) to advance clinical genomics and;
3. Enhancing the understanding and/or delivery of genomic information in the health care system.

All projects incorporate allied researchers from institutions and hospitals across the Toronto genomic research community. This year's competition awarded grants to nine research institutions across the University of Toronto's health science community. Among the successful grants is a one-year, \$80,000 project entitled "Next Generation Diagnostics: Advancing the Clinical Application of Genomic Analysis," co-led by **Dr. Jordan Lerner-Ellis** (Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathobiology, Mount Sinai Hospital) and **Dr. Tracy Stockley** (Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathobiology, Hospital for Sick Children).

AAMC - Abraham Flexner Award

The Abraham Flexner Award for Distinguished Service to Medical Education is granted annually to an individual for extraordinary contributions to the medical education community. The Flexner Award recognizes the highest standards in medical education and honors individuals whose impact on medical education is national in scope.

AAMC - Alpha Omega Alpha (AOA) Robert J. Glaser Distinguished Teacher Awards

The Alpha Omega Alpha Robert J. Glaser Distinguished Teacher Awards were established by the AOA medical honor society in 1988 to provide national recognition to faculty members who have distinguished themselves in medical student education.

OCUFA - Teaching Award

Each year the Ontario Confederation of University Faculty Associations recognizes outstanding teachers and academic librarians in Ontario universities through its Teaching and Academic Librarianship Awards.


