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Message from the Dean

Welcome back after the break and hope you had a restful holiday. As we enter 2013, it is my pleasure to present the [Year 1 Activity Report on the 2011-2016 Strategic Academic Plan](#).

Measuring performance against our specific strategic goals is of utmost importance. This is the focus of our Activity Report and enables us to compare our performance with our peers -- the best Faculties of Medicine around the world. The Report's performance indicators highlight that we have much more work to do, but I am gratified that we're making

excellent progress across the board.

For example, in 2011, the rate of Faculty of Medicine researchers both on- and off-campus citing U of T on their publications rose to 80.3 per cent, up from 74.8 per cent in 2010. Our integrated data management system, which will provide up-to-date content for academic, research and administrative performance indicators, is on track to launch in fall 2013. We completed an Alumni Relations Strategic Plan, and most Department Chairs have identified alumni relations as central to their strategic plans. We are more than halfway to this year's fundraising goal of \$40 million by May 2013.

Academic indicators also show strong evidence of progress. The Centre for Interprofessional Education has tripled the number of elective options in the university's health science programs. We continued to build key international research partnerships through with top-ranked institutions such as Hong Kong University, the Karolinska Institutet in Sweden and the University of São Paulo in Brazil.

Our researchers also set a very high bar in 2011-2012. Total direct research funding for our faculty members across the Toronto Academic Health Science Network grew to \$918 million. We launched the Fraser Mustard Institute for Human Development in partnership with OISE/U of T, taking interdisciplinary collaboration to a new level and blending our health and education mission. External accreditation reviews -- another important measure of performance -- were also very positive. Accreditors found our undergraduate MD Program to be fully compliant on 119 of 128 standards, granting us accreditation for another eight years, a renewal that includes the new Mississauga Academy of Medicine satellite.

While these and the other comprehensive metrics in our Year 1 Activity Report show the Faculty moving forward on many fronts, they also offer an opportunity to identify shortcomings and adjust our strategic planning accordingly. The leadership of the Faculty welcomes your feedback on the Report. Above all, I'm looking forward

to continuing our work together as we refine and measure our exciting priorities in 2013.

***Living Longer, Living Well* report outlines key strategies for curbing health care costs for seniors**

Prof. Samir Sinha (Department of Medicine) has released a groundbreaking report that outlines over 100 recommendations for

reducing skyrocketing health care costs for seniors. In his report -- called *Living Longer, Living Well* -- the provincial lead of Ontario's Senior Strategy suggests exploring an income-based system for home care and community support services. The release of Prof. Sinha's report received coverage from major news organizations such as the CBC, Globe and Mail and Toronto Star.

Chair of Department of Family and Community Medicine

Professor Lynn Wilson has been re-appointed for a second five-year term as Chair of the Department of Family & Community Medicine, effective January 1, 2013. A recent external review of the department recognized the tremendous accomplishments of the Department of Family & Community Medicine under Prof. Wilson's collaborative leadership. Among other initiatives, Prof. Wilson is a Co-Director of BRIDGES, a three-year project funded by the Ministry of Health to support the design and implementation of innovative models of care that promote integration in the health care system.

Interim Vice-Dean, Graduate and Life Sciences Education

Professor Avrum Gotlieb has been appointed Interim Vice-Dean, Graduate and Life Sciences Education, effective November 1, 2012. His portfolio of Vice-Dean, Graduate Affairs was revised to Vice-Dean, Graduate and Life Sciences Education (GLSE), and encompasses two major education activities in the Faculty of Medicine -- Graduate Education and Undergraduate Education in the Life Sciences including Arts and Science and other interdivisional teaching. Prof. Gotlieb will maintain his role as Senior Academic Advisor to the Dean of Medicine, with responsibility for chairing the Decanal Promotions Committee, and he will continue chairing the Faculty Academic Appointment Committee.
